HOW TO PRINT

INSTRUCTIONS IN PRINTING

Before shipping, each press is carefully tested to see that it is perfect in every respect and set to the standard type height. The press should be placed on a low table or box, and fastened so that it can be easily operated. Keep the wearing parts oiled just enough to make them run smoothly. The chase, ink rollers, ink table or ink disc are all removable, and can be taken out or put back again at will. The rollers should always be removed from the press when you desire to clean them, and when not in use, they should never be left in the press, but kept suspended so nothing will come in contact with the gelatin part of the roller. Use benzine or gasoline for cleaning rollers.

In unpacking the type, handle the package carefully, so as not to "pi" or mix the letters. The catalogue number of the type is always marked on the wrapper. First distribute the type in the case, being very careful to get the letters and characters in the proper compartments. Be careful about your b's, d's, p's, and q's. These are the most difficult letters to distinguish, one from the other, in type. However, a little practice will soon make them plain to you.

Laying the Type in the Cases

Place the type case before you. Unwrap the package of type very carefully, and after untying the font, begin at the top line and place the letters and other characters in the compartments of the type case, in the order indicated in the diagram. Care must be taken not to mar the faces of the type by rubbing them against the sides of the case. In small fonts, both capitals and small letters may be placed in the same compartment. In large fonts, two type cases are recommended, one for the capitals and one for the small letters. When there are more characters in the font than are indicated in the diagram, place them in the compartments that will seem the most convenient.

The diagram above is the plan of our small, or single case. We have another style of case called a "double case", which is well to have in using Roman fonts, or when there are large fonts of "upper case" and lower case" or capitals and small letters.

Setting the Type

Take up any piece of type and examine it. On part of the body you will find one or more "nicks" or "notches." These nicks will guide you to set the type uniformly and the proper way.




After adjusting your composing stick to the width of the job you desire to print, hold the stick in the left hand in the position herewith illustrated. With the type case before you, the type is picked up, one piece at a time and placed in the stick, with the nick in the type upward, holding the thumb against the line of type as it increases in length. When you have finished setting the lettering in one line, take out or put in spaces until it fits tight enough to

hold in the stick. Spaces are made of different thicknesses for this purpose. Don't space too tight, and be careful that each line is uniform in respect to spacing.

A little careful practice will accustom you to handle the type properly, and you will be astonished how little time it takes to set a first class job.

Emptying the Stick



When the stick is full it is emptied in the following manner: Remove the chase (iron frame which holds type in the press) from the press and place it on a level surface. The type is now taken hold of as represented in the above illustration, the thumbs pressing in the rear. Lift all the type out of the stick and place it on the level surface, inside the chase. Keep the nicks, which are on the type, facing the top of the chase.

If it is desired to have the lines spaced wider apart, leads are inserted to suit. Leads are not furnished with presses numbers, 9, 10 and 11, but are listed in the accessories and may be purchased at the price quoted.

In the composition, or type setting of any job, should any trouble arise, observe some similar work already printed and the correct way will be clear to you.

Locking Up The Form

This operation consists of securely fastening the type inside the chase.

Fill in the vacant spaces between the type and the chase with the wooden strips, called printer's furniture. Put the iron strip in front of the points of the screws in the chase, to prevent bruising the furniture or type. The screws in the chase should now be tightened up, slightly. In the larger presses, where quoins are furnished, put one pair at the end and two pairs at the bottom. Tighten up the quoins slightly, by means of the key which is furnished for this purpose.

The planer, a piece of hard wood moulding, is now placed on the type and gently tapped until all the type is on its "feet", and none remain higher than the others. The screws are now tightened or the quoins are made tighter by means of the key, until the type is held firmly in the chase, so that no type will fall out when the chase is lifted. Screws are used in presses numbers, 9, 10 and 11, while quoins and key are applied in presses numbers 12, 13 and 14.

Press Work

Put the chase into its proper place in the press and fasten it.

If the job is a bill-head, letter-head, or work of that kind, put five or six thicknesses of white paper on the platen, which is held there by means of the wire bands. This forms a cushion and will take up any slight uneveness. If cards are to be printed three or four sheets of paper will be sufficient.

Put a small quantity of ink on the plate and distribute it evenly and thoroughly, then move the roller over the type and make an impression. If the printing is too light or too heavy, it can be adjusted as follows: On presses numbers, 10, 11, 12 and 13, turn center screw found in back of the press, to the left two or three times. Then adjust the corner screws gradually until your form prints evenly. After adjustment is made tighten the center screw. On number 14 press, turn center nut on the front of the press two or three times to the left. Adjust the four corner bolts until your form prints evenly, then tighten the center nut.

In gauging a job, for example a card, so as to print in the middle of the card, use the impression made on the tympan sheet as a guide. Gauge pins, which can be made from ordinary pins, are put in the paper on which the impression was made, placing the pins proper distance below the printing to give the correct margin. A gauge pin is also placed at the left hand side of the impression, allowing space for proper margin.

Bronzing

After the impression is made with ink, take a small piece of raw cotton, dip same in the bronze and apply it to each impression by patting it with the cotton. Never apply by rubbing.

Distributing the Type

After the job of printing has been completed, the hease should be taken out of the press and the type cleaned by brushing with gasoline or benzine.

In distributing the type back into the case, the type should be moistened with water, and two or three lines taken up at a time. The type should be held level in the left hand, with the nicks upward and face toward the printer. Distribute the type back into the various compartments of the case exactly as you did when you first "laid" the type.

It will be seen that the several operations are all very simple and can be learned in a very short time.

SPECIMENS OF TYPE

We show on this and following pages a partial list of our type, which will meet the requirements of ordinary printing. We have aimed, in putting up these fonts, to select what would prove of real value and adapted to general use. The fonts are of such size as to make them practical, yet low enough in price to enable most anyone to secure a number of styles, and so be prepared to turn out neat and attractive work. All the type shown is of the usual or standard height, and such as is used in all regular printing offices, and is made on the Point System. The sizes in these pages are 6-point, 10-point, 12-point, and multiples of these sizes, so that there will be found no difficulty in using the different sizes together. The quantity of letters in a font of type is designated by the number of A's, all the other characters being in proportion, therefore you will find more vowels than other letters that are less important. Some letters are used much oftener than others. See any printed page and note the preponderance of a's and e's over x's and z's. Smaller fonts than here designated cannot be furnished. When fonts have small letters and small capitals these characters are shown in the specimen lines.

Some fonts have Capital Letters only and are designated by the number of Capital A's such as "10-A." Other fonts have Capital and Small Letters and are designated such as "10-A" "20-a," meaning 10 Capital A's and 20 Small a's.

When ordering, always give the Number over the Font and the Price. If to be sent by mail, add the amount of postage.




